However, I do believe we should encourage public-private partnerships to support public arts and cultural programs.

Would you support reallocating the current 40% General Fund set aside from the Transient Occupancy Tax (aka TOT or Hotel Tax) to arts, culture, and tourism programs? Why or why not?

San Jose is experiencing budget deficits and I do not support additional spending mandates while we work to close the gap and ensure funding of already existing programs.
